Dear Harold,

All the free time I was complaining about last month has disappeared. Shortly after my last letter to you, I got a job working in a card and gift shop. It's boring as hell but at least it will keep me in money while I look for something else. Also last month, I was asked to run for controller and, after thinking about it for a few seconds, decided it was time for me to really get my feet wet in politics. It's going to be a very interesting campaign. Alex Schultz, the guy who just finished law school and who lost in his Primary bid for the controllership, is managing my campaign. We are expecting a "dirty" campaign because, after Alex lost in the primary, the party machine assumed that their



troubles were over & that their man for controller would be running unopposed in the general election.

We definitely caught them off guard and have them worried. A friend of mine who happened to be present when the borough manager, who is the real bastard we're trying to get rid of, heard that I and 2 other people had filed petitions to run against the 'machine' quoted him as saying, "Son of a bitch, I thought we were through with all this B.S. in the primary; what are they trying to prove."

To top the whole thing off, the man I'm supposed to be running against has a County job & was ordered by the Court to either withdraw from the election or lose his job.

Allegheny County has a reputation for handing out patronage jobs, but the Court



is at least trying to appear to be doing something. Unfortunately, the Court isn't enforcing the decision & 2 deadlines have passed without the man withdrawing. If both he & the Court continue to ignore the order, there's a chance he may go ahead & run and then, if elected, resign so as to keep his job. If that happens, & we strongly suspect that's their plan, the borough manager can then "appoint" someone to fill the vacancy. The whole election would have been a fraud.
