I don't disagree with your specific points on The Salamalikis Speech. It is not my understanding that Linco considers The CIA as "good". Garrison probably misinterpreted his concept. Would this not be typical of N.G.?

In any case the speech does address a significant issue - The public failure to see the assassinations as part of a continuum. Of course, you addressed this point in Coup and Tiger.

The Tonkin Bay Affair by Eugene Winicki indirectly lays bare The Pentagon Papers scandal and confirms your

Belief that J.F.K. had ordered  
a review of the entire situation  
with a view towards withdrawal.

I regard Ellsberg as a  
malleable dupe at best.  
Only 141 Americans had died  
in Vietnam on Nov. 22, 1963  
as per Wimolady.

The Pentagon Papers and  
the attempt to blur any  
difference between L.B.J.  
and J.F.K. is a cynical and  
gross propaganda effort,  
an act worthy of "All  
The News That's Fit To Print."
