Dear Mr. Bohn,

May I express my appreciation for what today must be described as your courage in printing the three very worthwhile articles by Leo Sauvage? I believe I am an expert in this field, and I intend no reflection on M. Sauvage in claiming to be even more of an expert than he, so I am in a position to evaluate his articles. Almost unique among the limited writings about the Warren Commission, his pieces have been devoid of factual error, a failing that has characterized almost everything I have seen.

Like M. Sauvage, I have written a book about it. Like his, as of several months ago, mine is also unpublished (in the United States). I have heard his has been contracted (mine is not). I am enclosing a letter to him I would appreciate your forwarding it.

M. Sauvage refers to an article by the Nashes in your issue of October 12, 1964. I have newspaper excerpts of it and would appreciate a copy, if one is available. If you have any other factual or supposedly factual articles you have carried I would also appreciate copies of them. I do not plan to revise my book to include this information, for I decided in advance to restrict myself entirely to the Commission's own evidence. But I would like to make my files and knowledge as complete as possible.
