GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Jan. 19 (AP) — Representative Harold S. Saw-yer, Republican of Michigan, has reportedly decided to dissent from the House Assasination Committee's opinion that a conspirate led to the experience led

House Assassination Committee's opinion that a conspiracy led to the assassinatin of President Kennedy.

John Westman, an aide to Mr. Sawyer, said that the Representative would file a formal dissent Monday.

A report from the Washington bureau of Newhouse Newspapers said that Mr. Sawyer had called the acoustical experts' conclusions that led to the conspiracy verdict "a lot of hogwash." He could not be reached for comment.

Eight committee members agreed last month that a conspiracy had probably led to President Kennedy's killing. Mr. Sawyer was one of the four committee members who did not attend that session.
