Dell Publishing, a subsidiary of the old-line publishing conglomerate of Doubleday, announced recently that it would bring out the autobiography of Judy Chavez.

Who is Judy Chavez? She is the dark-haired, 22-year-old former employee of a Washington, D.C., escort service who allegedly was paid \$500 a "date" and later \$5000 a month by Arkady Shevchenko.
