Dear Professor Schlesinger:

Enclosed is a copy of Harold Weisberg's manuscript book Never Again, which I understand from correspondence with him I am to send you.

In preparation of the script from computer files I encountered a number of minor technical problems between the several computer programs used in the course of its composition and my printer. One of these required a new paragraphing of two of the early chapters that upon my reading is perfectly sound. Chapter ten was set aside for possible use but was never needed and is a blank. It is conceivable there are a few typos and other quite minor changes that Mr. Weisberg caught in his final draft and were not corrected at my end. If any these are quite trivial.

It is my understanding that Mr. Weisberg will or has written you concerning this script.

I would add a word about his work in the field of President Kennedy's assassination. So many of the writers--indeed almost all--come down on the subject with partisan focus and end up on one side or the other of the subject, leaving scholarship an orphan. Weisberg does not belong to the camps of theorists and speculators and exploiters of the subject, but works from the factual base toward the end of discovering what happened rather than answering the question of who shot him. I would also add that in my several years of careful reading and work on the subject I have concluded Harold Weisberg is the most informed person on this subject. His knowledge is phenomenal, his judgments certain, his character unblemished.
