A sincerely hope you have received the tape recording by now. Unfortunately my taping equipment was on the blink so you have the one and only recording.

I am sorry about the address foul up. I had you look at my office and advise that address for the letter and the tape.

Please advise me if you do not receive it.

On my second call to Mr. Corolla I did ask him how he was informed, and he stated



that this group called a  
news conference (kind of unusual  
when they are supposed to be  
representing a client, I would  
think) and that he got  
wind of it from his "usual  
source".

I am going to call Mr.  
Carolla and I hope he will  
return my call before I finish  
this letter. I am going to attempt  
to persuade him to contact  
me when and if he hears  
anything further on this bunch.  
I did check the yellow pages,  
and the white pages, I also called



Dallas information, and I cannot  
obtain a number or address for them.

my calls. However I am confident  
he will when he has time.
