The House Committee in their Report (Page 7), ask that the Justice Dept. check out the Bronson film.

So I checked out Grodner's Serient, page 308, Hearings, Vol. 6. He reports that a man in the No. 1 window appears to be wearing a reddish shirt. That rang a bell.

Arnold Rowland - who got a lot of things wrong - did testify that he saw a black man at window No. 1 wearing a "bright" red and green shirt. He told the FBI about this the day after the assassination, but they seemed not interested. (2H188). That checks out!

Next comes the "chicken bone story" that became lost in time. Hank Norman testified he ate his lunch on the 6th floor before the shooting. Sheriff Mooney was the first on the scene to view the "sniper's nest." He found not just 3 "hulls". He also found chicken bones, a pop bottle, and a paper lunch sack. (Never mind what Fritz said.) Grodner missed all of this. (P. 310)

Would it not be interesting to know what Norman wore that day?

Do you have Robert Grodner's address?
