My dear Harold Weisberg:

When I wrote you for a copy of

page 243 are complete and correct for pagination.  
After page 243 only one item checks out. (I  
used the Post Mortem citations, including a  
few random items.)

I am curious about what  
happened.

One inference I make is that  
the original copy ended with what became  
Chapter 22. Another is that beginning  
with Chap. 23 extensive revision occurred.  
There is some evidence that the lists are  
off by two pages throughout, but not  
consistently.
