It was well worth the literally hundreds of hours (due purely to the massive beaurocaacies with which I was forced to deal) I spent to arrange it. As usual, he was only too glad to work hard, so he spent pretty close to 24 hours total making speeches, on radio, and TV. Some of his taak was taped and will be replayed during the weeks to come, and people are still calling into the radio stations about him.

I'm sorry for any werry I caused you by calling you a week ago, but I wasn't aware of his schedule change. I waited until just before the 4 PM press conference to call, hoping he would arrive before I was forced to contact you. As it turned out, everything worked out well. We had Penn Jones Jr. on the radio (via telephone) for an hour, and even a short interview with Steve Burton by phone.

Enclosed are copies of articles dealing with Harold's visit and the other things which preceded it in order to draw attention to it such as a lecture given by me and a showing of "Rush to Judgment." This has all given me a chance to arouse people and keep them aroused, something I was unable to do by myself last year when I had a series published in the major newspaper and a lenthy magazine article.
