I recently enjoyed taking part in a conversation over the telephone between you and Vince Salandria. I have been working on the case for some time now but have accomplished a good deal less in the past four years then semeone like yourself. I have, however, some unpublished work on the autopsy of the head in which you might be interested. Furthermore, I have spent considerable time conducting investigations concerning some obscure aspects of the case which have begun to look less and less obscure as the investigation proceeds. I am currently working on a full report on this work and will see iffat you get a copy if you so desire. All of my work is communicated directly rather than by phone or letter for obvious reasons.

Enclosed is a money order which I hope will be sufficient to enable you to send me copies of both Whitewash III and your new book, Oswald in New Orleans. Until your conversation with Vince the latter was unknown to me. As for the former, I have been unable to get it in bookstores in the Midwest. I generally do not order critics' books directly from the publisher since requesting them from bookstores usually results in the store stocking them. In this case, it did not work.

Should you ever venture into this land of ice and snow, please call on me and I will do my best to get you press conferences, etc. Mark Lane dropped by out here and I got him on radio, TV, etc. for almost an entire day. I also managed good newspaper coverage since the largest newspaper in the area published a week-long series by me on the assassination.

Best of luck in your work. I somehow feel that the security of this nation is somewhat dependent on the stamina of persons like yourself.
