I work full time and then have to do my free clinic work in the evenings, so I use the rest of the time for recreation.

Before I mail this I am going to try to get some stuff on RFK off to you. This is a tough week since I will be addressing the Bar Association Convention about assassination on Thurs. and then flying to SF on Fri. morning. That first weekend of the 19th & 20th will be rough since that is when the heroin symposium is, and Mon. and Tues will be spent seeing drug treatment people, but starting Wed. of next week (23rd) I should have free time, hopefully for a week, since I hope to stay until June 30. We should be able to spend some time together. You will get on well with Guisepe. I don't know about a meeting with Smith, since I don't know when or how I will be getting together with him myself, but I will try to see if you can make it too.

Thanks for the offer of a place to stay. At least for the beginning of the time in SF I will be staying with Guisepe Slater at 271 Fredrick St., SF 664-2454. I will get in touch sometime after I get in.
