Dear Dr. SerVaas:

Thanks for your call last night.

After talking with you, and especially after discussing what got me interested in the case (e.g. witnesses I interviewed who had felt threatened), I realized that I do have a personal interest and concern about the deaths and misadventure which followed the assassination of John Kennedy. I guess that discussion put me in touch with some feelings I have not dealt with for a while.

So, despite my other obligations, I'd like to try to rough out an article. I did do some investigating on the subject of some of the deaths prior to a series I wrote for the Minneapolis Star/Tribune in late 1966 and early 1967 and also for an article in Ivory Tower Magazine in early 1967 and will review my old notes.

I think that within the next two weeks I can send you a rough article. At that time it should be clear to all of us how much additional investigative work, and specifically what sort of investigative work and picture-taking, would be necessary for a good article. Frankly it is hard to know until it is put together. In other words, I think that I can do a bit better than just an outline. I certainly owe that to the many people who continued to tell the truth to the FBI and Warren Commission despite the pressures.

So, I should be in touch again soon.
