Thank you very much for your letter of the 4th and its enclose. For your convenience I enclose a copy of your letter and of two pages of the enclosure, to which I refer below.

Two of the records listed in the enclosure, Nos. 492 and 1042, are of considerable interest to me and probably to others.

As the comment on 1042 says, there was a time when it was thought that Lee Harvey Oswald was somehow involved in the death of Martin Schrand. The official inquiry concluded it was suicide.

What the Commission published is inadequate. I'd appreciate copies of the pages it did not publish. Pages 2-12 of 492 are published in the Commission's appendix but pages 1 and 13-20 are not published. None of 1042 is published.

HR, EB, Navy JAG records on LHO HW 7/8/77

Under date of 7/5/77 I have received the Navy JG records relating to LHO.

These relate to the court martial over the drink incident and the death of Private Martin Shrand.

I have gone over these in haste. There are several references to the death occurring near the "crypto van," which it appears Schrand was guarding.

It appears that the Navy was never able to locate those to whom the Oswald connection was attributed. From these records, that is,

And that this effort started because of the WC.

I cannot not pay much attention to this.

~~But~~ I do note that to now the same Navy has not been able to come up with records of Oswald's clearances for security or what they were and that from one who represented himself as a former Marine friend of Oswald, as set forth in OJ/ in N.O.,¹ learned that Oswald had security clearance for crypto. That the work he did required a clearance of at least secret is the testimony of the commissioned officer under whom he did that work. Lt. Donovan.
