

## 6-Month Delay Likely in JFK Death Probe

WASHINGTON (AP) — A delay of six months is expected before the new Senate intelligence oversight committee decides whether to reopen the investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy, chairman Daniel K. Inouye (D-Hawaii) said Thursday.

The new panel is expected to hear testimony from the CIA's former director, William J. Casey, and other intelligence community officials.

Inouye said the committee will not begin its work until after the release of the CIA's report on the assassination, which is expected to be published in the next few weeks.
