I want to take this opportunity to thank you for coming up from Texas last week to make available to me the extensive photographic work which you have done regarding the Kennedy assassination.

As I indicated during our meeting, I am extremely interested in the results you have obtained, and I think the major discrepancies suggested by your photos require additional investigation.

Subsequent to our meeting, I have had additional discussions with other experts, and have been advised it would be essential to examine the original negatives for all photos in question in order to confirm that the apparent discrepancies have not been caused by retouching somewhere along the line. Obviously this will be difficult, and might be impossible, but I have asked the Select Committee staff to inquire into the feasibility of such a comparison. In addition, there may be other checks which can be helpful, and I will continue to give this matter serious study.

I very much appreciate the names enclosed in your letter, and I understand that Dave Marston has already been in touch with several of these people. Please keep in touch with my office as you continue your work, and thank you again.
