Paul wrote me recently about some withheld documents from CD 7 we have obtained. Among those he mentioned is 770, Barbara Brookey. I was under the impression I had this, but I made a note of it to be certain it is not overlooked in preparing the suit. Having just seen that note I checked to see if I have it and I have no card on it and do not have it in my file on her. I would, therefore, appreciate a copy. I was under the impression Gary had given it to me long ago.

I have not been able to do any work on that suit for a while because I've been working on the book and the appendix. Gradually I am getting the captions written and mounted.

If you missed it on CBS' "Face the Nation" today, David Hilliard, for the first time for any militant black, to my knowledge, mentioned Martin Luther King as other than some kind of Uncle Tom. I think the awful excesses in the campaign against the Black Panthers may, for a while, anyway, work our way. I missed it, but I caught it on a newscast when Ralph Bunche said the black militants are without confidence in Mitchell and Agnew and then, interrupting his questioner to continue, said he agrees with them. That is something.
