This is in further response to your February 2, 1992, Freedom of Information Act request to Walter Reed Army Medical Center for information pertaining to the autopsy of the late President John F. Kennedy.

The enclosed documents were forwarded to this office by the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology for a releasability determination. You will note that portions of the documents are "blacked out." These portions apparently were "blacked out" by Colonel Finck or Brigadier General Blumberg prior to the time the documents came into the custody of the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology. Although these portions are readable on the original, the process of reproducing copies for release rendered the "blacked out" portions illegible. We have handwritten in the content of those "blacked out" portions on your copies. In all other respects, the copies you have received are exact duplicates of those maintained in the files of the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology. Neither this office nor the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology have redacted any information on the documents.

As to the remaining items you requested, a search of the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology Medical Museum Archives revealed no records responsive to your request. Your request has also been forwarded to the following offices or agencies:
