In the interest of total coverage, it may be helpful to note the DOD problems and total response and accuracy, etc. This is confidential.

As one, formerly with DOD, I feel that total coverage is the big issue. My impression is that many materials on the JFK matter may yet exist to be perused and studied (documents).

Some it seems to me may be mis-labeled, either by accident or by intentional plan. Some may be hidden and withheld. Herein are my areas of concern:

- (1) The Central Archives at the Pathology Institute, Walter Reed is DOD and JFK related. However, the Medical Museum, DOD, at the Pathology Institute is separate. So is the Pentagon related Archive at the Pathology Institute. There may also be other Archives therein (SIDS, TUMOR FASCICLES, ARP, and AIDS, etc.). These are all separate Archives. If you do not receive all materials available, it is because of this problem.
- (2) Where are the JFK related materials of the DOD from the old pre-1965 Medical Museum on Constitution Ave., near Independence? Did all go to Bethesda for storage and then to Walter Reed? Who had oversight? Did the JFK partial brain in formalin go to the Constitution Ave. Museum as has been suggested? Then back to the Archives and to Robert F. Kennedy?
- (3) Where are the CQ lists? CQ as in charge-of-quarter lists for Nov. 18-25 in 1963? Where are the lists for the Medical Museum? Where are the lists for Bethesda? Where are the lists for Walter Reed? Where are the lists for the Pathology Institute?
- (4) Where are the statements of "non-disclosure" allegedly signed with the FBI by various DOD staff at the Medical Museum, Walter Reed, the Pathology Institute, Bethesda Naval, etc.?
- (5) Please note the photographic autopsy work of Ms. Joan Schilling and the related role of Mr. Kenneth Vrtacnik in the JFK matters. This is still unclear. It is my information that they are still employed by the Pathology Institute at Walter Reed.
- (6) There may be specialized historical files on Blumberg, Karnei and Pierre Fincke at the Pathology Institute, and others, etc.
- (7) Computer files may also exist--or may be now destroyed and erased. ADP and tomography is present at several DOD sites.
- (8) In addition, please look at the ballistic missile and ballistic trauma studies. Fincke did several in 1965-1968. Some were Vietnam; some were JFK. Some could be mislabeled. One was Fincke & Halsman, et al.
