

A D D E N D A: (7/2000)

In viewing the John McAdams 2000 Website (Kennedy Assassination Home Page) on the JFK motorcade one readily notes the (unverified, uncertified) frontpage reproduction copy of the final edition B/W (limited circulation, numbers unknown) of the DALLAS TIMES HERALD, p. 1, of Thursday evening on November 21, 1963. The Library of Congress in DC did not have a paper copy of this for comparison on text and circulation. There is a truncated view, close cropped, of a relevant motorcade diagram. We can also view the entire front page of the DTH of Nov. 21, 1963 on the DTH text pages online, Netscape, Internet, listed as Dallas Times Herald (1963). This limited edition of the DTH of 21 November 1963 has a totally correct diagram of the JFK Presidential motorcade route for 22 November. The DTH diagram shows arrows of progression in the motorcade, showing Houston Street to Elm Street (given in text narrative form only on 19 November). We can still claim that the posted route of 22 November in the Dallas Morning Times was the main circulation route given for Friday 22 November, and the diagram given therein was slightly inaccurate and misleading, showing Main Street only as the primary route. In addition, the diagram in the DMN edition could have easily inserted arrows at the bottom portion, stating: "Houston to Elm," or "Houston to Elm", or some variant thereabouts. However, no such arrows appeared in the DMN edition at the critical juncture point. Finally, very few copies of the DTH edition were even in circulation, and none would probably appear on 22 November newsstands since the paper was dated 21 November.

One big question here is: Can we totally verify that this front page copy of 21 November (evening) from the DTH files or McAdams files is a true circulated copy of the JFK route? Or could this be a backdated copy from 22 November (evening)? Or a bogus or altered copy? The DTH evidently no longer publishes a copy (per M. Odnitz, Texas Historical Society, online 6/2000 e-mail). Can we verify the McAdams Netscape via copy as totally reliable? The Webmaster for the DTH is allegedly Aaron Hendricks. This DTH controversy needs to be reviewed and researched thoroughly. We need to inspect and verify a paper copy not a microfilm or Internet copy. Hopefully, this issue can be readily resolved. The archive copies of DTH must be made open and available.
