

Statement - Special Agent SAMUEL A. KINNEY, White House Detail, U.S. Secret Service, dated November 30, 1963.

This statement appears in Vol. 18, pp. 730-731, and is almost two full typewritten pages.

On the second page he devotes 7 lines to the assassination itself. He heard 3 shots.

He says that ^{at} the hospital he spent 20 to 30 minutes putting the bubble top and the canvas cover on the Presidential car; he makes no reference to any examination of the car for evidence, or any washing of the car.

Again ^{this} ~~xxxxx~~ statement is remarkable for the little attention it devotes to the main subject, the assassination.

On p. 732 is a brief 4-paragraph statement by Kinney dated 11-22-63. In this he says, "The first shot was fired as we were going into an underpass." He also "observed hair flying from the right side" of the President's head.

Note the entirely incorrect statement about the location of the car when the shot was fired; note also that, even though someone saw parts of the President flying away, the area was not searched, as subsequent statements show, until the following day.
