The entire first page is devoted to background.

But at the very top of the second page is an extremely important fact. He says, "Directly in front of us was an underpass with a green sign with white lettering, stating 'Entering Thornton Freeway'." This he said was after they had turned into Elm Street. Compare this with my comment on the pictures wherein I discuss the removal of some of the signs, one of them actually mentioning the Thornton Freeway.

He estimated the total time lapse between the first and the third shots that he heard at "within 5 seconds". He saw the President struck by the third shot. He also places the time of the shooting at 12:25 and the arrival at the hospital at 12:30.

On p.748 he has a short 4-paragraph statement dated the 22nd. It adds nothing.

Note with respect to McIntyre's statement and those of other agents in the followup car, that the photographs, especially the Altgens photograph, which was taken after the President was shot for the first time, does not confirm their allegations that they turned to seek the source of the shots.
