Dear Mr. Roffman:

Reference is made to your recent request under the Freedom of Information Act for certain records and files pertaining to the autopsy of former President John F. Kennedy.

In that connection, almost all the documentation and physical evidence in the possession of the Secret Service has been transferred to the National Archives. That agency has been designated as the official depository of all material relating to the assassination of the former President. However, in response to your request, we have conducted an extensive search of the materials which are currently maintained in the records of the Secret Service. Attached hereto are copies of all documents currently maintained in Secret Service files which relate to your inquiry. With respect to paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 of your letter, the file search indicates that we do not currently maintain any information relating to the subject matter of your request.


With respect to items 4 and 5 of your request, there is attached hereto all documents currently maintained in Secret Service files which relate to the subject matter of your request.

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Fees are charged in accordance with Title 31 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1A, Section 1.6(g). For your request, search time was 10 hours at \$5.00 per hour and 16 xerox pages at \$.10 per page.
