However, I still desire copies of the information I have requested. You will recell that on the eccesion of our meeting March 4, three and a helf months ago, I discussed these things and gave you a copy of the brief notes I useds to keep the various items in mind. Aside from your own notes, you have these to remind you. Because I am aware that you have pressing obligations, I have not hept after you about this, but my interests and my desire for this information, where it exists, is unchanged. And guite some times has elepsed.

Among the things in which 1 have most interest, things that do exist and have not been supplied in response to my requests, saids from these about which I have recently emphasized my interest, are these two:

The autoppy notes, conveyed to the Secret Service, in part described as in Dr. Humas' hands much be testified, and of which other proofs are in my possession. These were made, did exist, and I sent you a copy of the mane with which they were fordwinded and receipted by your againsy.

The statements obtained by Secret Service agents from the Parkh ad medical people, referred to in GDES. My last request, of the Archiws, for these, dated November 18 of last year, is without answer.

I remind you again that I have not received from the Archives that which you told me you had given them to be given to me. They have not, in fact, even written me that you forwarded these things. I remind you again that this menner of delivery is not prescribed by or required by the law and does not meet with my request, especially when not accompanied with the coveringt letters. It would be helpful if I had these covering letters.

If you believe enother meeting could serve a useful purpose, please let no know. As matters new rest, my syticus are more limited them they need to or them I prefer.
