The Johnson letter of 12/8 is hardly a reflection of the file or the correspondence. It mentions only the last of the reasons given me.

You can form your own opinion about the rest of it and of any significance this thing may or may not have for you.

If you read the last sentence and compare it with the (sorry, poor) copies of the two Burke Marshall letters to me, perhaps you will agree with me that this sentence is at best a self-serving gratuity. I do not think he intended writing or asking Marshall, whose two letters are answer enough. Archives had copies of them when this was written me. In any event, there has been no word to me since.
