Dear Mr. Rowley,

Inventoried as one of its source materials in the report of the special panel convened by then Attorney General Clark on the pictures and X-rays of the autopsy of President Kennedy is a memorandum of transfer dated April 26, 1965.

Because your agency is the agency of origin, I am writing to ask for a copy. For this purpose, whether or not there may be a copy or copies elsewhere is immaterial, I believe.

Because this document is one of the basic working papers and source materials of the report of this panel, used and published by the Government, I believe that if it was held to be subject to withholding before this use, the use in itself ended that possibility.

While I hope and expect you will respond by sending me a copy of this document, I am aware of a contrary possibility. In that event I respectfully ask that, as I believe is required by the Freedom of Information law, you explain in writing and cite the reason or authority.

Should you refuse this, I also ask that you send me whatever instructions and forms might be required for my making formal request for this document under the Freedom of Information law.
