Dear Mr. Weisberg:

In response to your letter of August 20, the Secret Service has no information concerning a man who had taken pictures of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy from inside the Dal-Tex Building. Special Agent in Charge Forrest Sorrels, Dallas, did enter the building described by Inspector J. Herbert Sawyer to talk to Mr. Zapruder concerning the pictures he (Zapruder) had taken.

Regarding the other matters raised in your letter of August 20, I can only repeat the information which has been furnished to you previously by the Secret Service; that is, that the Secret Service had no information pertaining to the assassination of President Kennedy which was not furnished to the Commission and its staff.

The Secret Service has no information, reports or evidence pertaining to the assassination of President Kennedy which was not turned over to the National Archives as directed by the Attorney General.
