Assassination of President Kennedy

copy of There is enclosed/letter from Asst. Chief of Police Charles Batchelor, Dallas, Texas, to Chief of Police Jesse E. Curry, to which is attached copies of assignment sheets covering the events held in connection with the visit of President John F. Kennedy to Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963. These sheets show that there were 56 men assigned to security at Love Field; 173 men for traffic and security along the parade route; 190 men for security inside the Trade Mart Building; and 74 men for security and traffic outside the Trade Mart Building. This is a total of 493 men, and included in this total are 46 men from the Texas Department of Public Safety and 14 men from the Dallas County Sheriff's Department

There is also enclosed copy of a report dated November 30, 1963, submitted to Chief of Police Curry by Assistant Chief of Police Charles Batchelor, Deputy Chief of Police, Service Division, George L. Lumpkin, and Deputy Chief of Police Criminal Investigation Division, M. W. Stevenson, giving a chronological report of events prior to, during and after the assassination of President Kennedy, the Slaying of Police Officer J. D. Tippit and Lee H. Oswald, and the apprehension of Jack Ruby, slayer of Oswald, compiled by the officers listed above.

A copy of letter dated December 19, 1963, from Chief of Police J. E. Curry to Mr. Elgin E. Crull, City Manager, City of Dallas, attaching a report covering the activities of Chief Curry concerning the visit of President Kennedy to Dallas on November 22, 1963, his assassination and the subsequent investigation and slaying of Lee Harvey Oswald on November 24, 1963, is enclosed.

Also there is enclosed a lengthy report of the "Investigation of the Operational Security Involving the oTransfer of Lee Harvey Oswald November 24, 1963" prepared by Captain of Police O. A. Jones of the Dallas Police Department. - See Doc.

Chief of Police Curry informed me today, January 6, 1964, that the commission headed by Chief Justice Farl Warren had requested, through Texas Attorney General Waggoner Carr, that the complete report be turned over to Attorney General Carr for forwarding to the commission and that the report had been delivered to Attorney General Carr today.
