SUBJECT:

Association of landlords where Lee Harvey Oswald lived, and Mr. Campbell of the Texas School Book Depository and the Campbell who was in conversation

with Jack Ruby.

The Chief's Office requested that a check be made of the landlords at the houses where Lee Harvey Oswald Yived in the Dallas area and determine if there was any relationship or association between these persons. A checkwas made of Mr. A. C. Johnson, Tandlord of 1026 North Beckley, Mr. M. W. George, landlord of 214 W. Neely St., Mrs. Hary E. Bledsoe, landlord of 621 No. Marsalis, and no relationship could be found among these people. They were all given the names of the other landlords and all stated that they were not personally acquainted in any way with these other persons.

Mr. O. V. Campbell, the employee of the Texas School Book Depository was contacted and advised of the fact that Ruby had been talking to a person named Campbell at the Dallas Morning News when the assassination took place and Mr. Campbell stated that he was in no way related to or associated with, or had knowledge of the Campbell who had been talking to Ruby at the time of the assassination.
