SUBJECT: Lee Harvey Oswald - Assassination of President John F. Kennedy

This will confirm long distance telephone conversation with Inspector Thomas J. Kelley at approximately 1:30 p.m. (CST) on February 20, 1964.

Inspector Kelley requested that inquiry be made to determine if Lee Harvey Oswald was fingerprinted at the time of his arrest in New Orleans on August 9, 1963, and whether or not the record indicated that subject had a scar or scars on either wrist.

While Inspector Kelley was on the line, Special Agent Anthony E. Gerrets communicated with the Bureau of Identification, New Orleans Police Department, by telephone and spoke with Mrs. Madden who advised that Oswald had been fingerprinted but that there was no record on the fingerprint chart, the back-up on his photograph, or other available records to indicate that he had any scars.

Inspector Kelley was so informed during our telephone conversation.
