## Gregory Only One Left Jailed in Chicago Clashes

CHICAGO, Sept. 3 (AP)—Civil rights activist Dick Gregory is the only person left in jail of the 583 persons arrested in demonstrations last week during the Democratic National Convention, a spokesman for the Chicago Legal Defense Committee says.

"As far as we know everyone is out," a spokesman said. "Now, there may have been one or two lost in the shuffle, but we don't know of any."

Gregory, who submitted voluntarily to arrest Thursday night when he tried to pass through a police blockade at the end of a line of marchers, has refused bail.

Most of the 583 arrested were charged with disorderly

conduct and some with resisting arrest. About 75 per cent of the bail bonds set were for \$25, the spokesman said.

However, bonds ranged as high as \$25,000 in some cases.

The majority of the arrests were made Wednesday and Thursday nights.

The Chicago police department, meanwhile, said today only one of the 152 policemen injured in last week's disorders still is in a hospital.

More than 300 demonstrators, hippies and others were injured in the clashes. Of the total 75 were treated in hospitals. Many of the other casualties were treated by medics—men and women in white gowns marked by crosses—who accompanied the demonstrators.
