

Agent Retires

Gerald A. Behn, appointed in 1961 by President Kennedy to head the White House detail of the Secret Service, retired Tuesday after a 27-year career of guarding such world leaders as Sir Winston Churchill and Queen Elizabeth.

More than 200 friends and representatives of the Roosevelt, Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy and Johnson Administrations honored Behn Friday at a reception in the Statler Hilton Hotel. In a ceremony at Secret Service headquarters, he was presented the Treasury Department's Albert Gallatin
