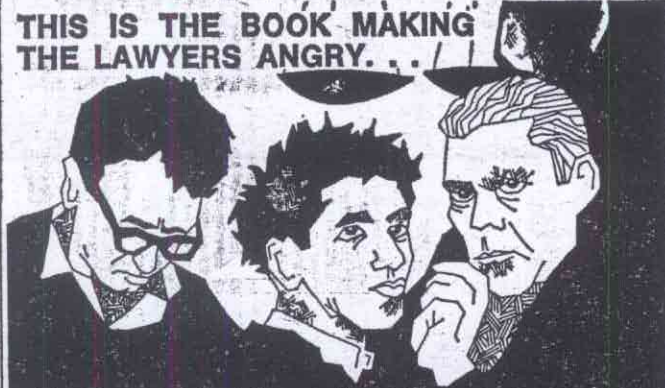

## **A Search for Justice**

In 1969, the American system of justice was confronted with the problem of how to deal with persons charged with the crime of political assassination. In a brief period of six months three men were tried in three separate state court jurisdictions—Clay Shaw, James Earl Ray, and Sirhan Sirhan.

**A SEARCH FOR JUSTICE** is an analysis of these trials. It is a book that questions whether "equal justice" in the courts of the land is equal, just—or even possible.
