If I remember correctly, some time ago I wrote in response to one of your columns to try to tell you that not all books on or supposedly on the JFK assassination are books that theorize solutions.

The very first book on the Warren Commission was the first of the four of my Whitewash series. It was completed mid-February, 1965, was printed in a limited edition that August, and went thito general distribution in May, 1966. The last of my published books - two are to be published this year - was Post Mortem.

The enclosed book is made up/of selections from these two book and the other three of the series.

I had nothing to do with the selections. As I remember from reading the proofs some time ago, the selections were made with good judgement.

If you have any interest in the subject matter or in satisfying yourself that there have been some books that do not theorize solutions, I think you may find this book includes no theories and is entirely factual in my use of the official evidence.

I've heard from more than 20,000 strangers over the past 27 years, without a single complaint from any one claiming I treated him unfairly and without a single error of any significance being alleged.

There are almost no minor errord. Almost all of those few came from errors in the official records.
