On page 7 of the interview with John Blazewick sent Tom Bethell by Stan Primmer is an interesting reference to William Seymour.

Blazewick is a sailor once connected with Cuban organizations in Florida. I spoke to him on a San-Francisco radio call-in program in November, as a consequence of which he was further interviewed.

Shown a picture of Seymour by Primmer, Blazewick could not recall his name but did the face. He recalled having seen this man in Chicago at a time seemingly consistent with Seymour's first trip to Florida and when he was one of a rough-looking groups on their way to Florida.

Blazewick though many of these men seemed to be drug addicts. Now when I questioned John George to see if he knew any of the group, the key that seems to have triggered his recollection was the Hall-Seymour October 1963 Dallas arrest on a dangerous-drug charge.

George recalled a pill wholesaler through whom he thinks he met them, particularly Hall.

If these men did recall Seymour, it is interesting that both connect him with drugs. I wonder if this could be a clue to Seymour.
