Paintings, Pottery to Be Seen at Reston

PAINTINGS by Shirley Shaneyfelt and ceramics by Edna Lee will be on display at Heron House Gallery, Reston, after a formal opening from 3 to 6 p.m. Dec. 11.

Mrs. Shaneyfelt is exhibiting several social comment paintings at the show: "Freedom March" shows the figure of a Negro man superimposed on black and white rectangles; "New Congress" comments on politics and government.

She has exhibited at the Smithsonian, Washington Gallery of Art, Georgetown University, and Old Towne Gallery.

Mrs. Lee, the potter, is director of the Lee Gallery, Alexandria. She is exhibiting bird baths, vases and bowls.

Mrs. Lee throws pots on the wheel, and also uses the coil process. This method builds the pot by joining rings of clay, one on top of another. Some of Mrs. Lee's pots are made by the Raku process, an ancient Oriental method.

The Heron House Gallery is situated in a high-rise apartment building on the lakefront at Reston. Gallery hours are from 1:30 to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday and from 7 to 9 p.m. Friday and Saturday. The Gallery is closed on Monday.

Mrs. Shaneyfelt and Mrs. Lee will exhibit their paintings and pottery through Christmas Day.
