Searches, field offices and FMIHQ
Improper withholdings - inconsistency, arbitrariness and capriciousness
Ulay Ham/Clay Bertrand; Prontiss Davis; andre Shaw; Fario Bersados

In another appeal deted today I address Davis and Andrews in connection with Clay Show and records not provided and searches not made.

Attached are two copies of the same record from different files reflecting improper and unjustified withholdings from one version that are not withhold in the other version. I regard this as more than more inconsistency, as arbitrariness and capricleamness with the intent of objuscating and confusing in an area of some sensitivity if not potential acute enbarrancement to the FM.

Here also I want to repeat that Clay Shaw and his ITM and associates there were reguling FRI sources (I believe properly and necessarily so although I also believe that because of this the FRI feared embarrasament once Shaw was charged) and that the CIA had admitted a seccingly immoment relationship with Clay Shaw prior to the processing and providing of the attached records.

I will also provide a separate but related appeal having to do with Jesse Core, in addition to similar prior appeals.

For your information, the FMI-IPM relationship involved retired SA Warren C.

De Brueys who is involved in a case filed in Mess York. As I have told you, Mr. Locar has a copy of that complaint if you do not.

Attended are 62-103000-4600 and the first page of the dot Mocorded copy from 105-82555 52-103060-4612. (I have already provided a San Antonio record that is relevant and purhaps a copy of the of the attached in connection with an earlier related appeal.)

If you require more of an explanation relating to Clay Bertmand than I have provided I can offer more information.

I have provided the first page only of the duplicate record because there are no withholdings from the subsequent pages. Also, they disclose what is withheld from 4608. The second and a later withholding from 4608 \aleph the name of Auron Kohn. To is so

Fart of the first withholding, not withheld on the duplicate, is the date, merch 19.

Do you know of any exception for the date? Particular if an I recall the record was disclosed if it is the San Anticio record referred to?

While the file identification of the duplicate copy indicated on 4608 is too unclear for cartainty some of the numbers do not appear to be those of that file.

The so-unliked "facts that follow the first page are neither assumete nor complete. One is proven to be false, that andrews was not able to use the phone. He did, averal times, as the FII knew but omits from this record. Among the incompletenesses in the fact that Oswald's consultation with andrews also included how to get into Merico — and Oswald appears to have used this advice. Others are that Oswald was accompanied by another person and that's same of andrews' homosommal clients also were present.

From what andress told me and is not in any FRI recents I've soon there was still more.

South 4612 appears to be exceptional. To copies are indicated for New Orleans or the Office of Origin, Dallas. The browity and avaidances in the Lift cause the original of that could be of interest that Mario Sermules know. And I recall no Pario Cormules records being provided by either office. But the fact of the Cormules-Shew relationship and associations were well and publicly known in New Orleans. Descudes cortainly was one the Fill should have questioned about Clay Sertrand.

Reportedly both also served on/the board of the Cordell Hall Foundation, as of the time of the Class foundation activities. The Lanyor who told no he investigated the allocations of the foundation's funds also told no that many went to Latin Americans

who could not be located.

If either of the phone numbers andre these provided in these special phone, no listing for him appears in the 1967 directory. This would seem to indicate a close personal relationship, close enough for him to have the unlisted number.

Yet the Liff Luxus even on identification of Andre Shan, what he does, has be know Shan, etc.

Meither is listed as a 1967 number of the LTM, when interesting.

The first contect with the El Paro PBI was the day of Shaw's arrest. It does not seem probable that andre would have made a contact the next day morely to say he was not related to Clay Shaw.

Then there is the 66 file in hi Paso, separate from its assemblation file. I have found some odd "administrative matters" in other 66 files.

In short, I believe a zoro diligent search is required, including in the field offices.
