HE SAID LEVALLEN EARLIER HAD TALKED VOLUNTARILY WITH THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S INVESTIGATORS EARLIER IN THE PROBE AND HAD ANSWERED ALL QUESTIONS ABOUT HIS ACQUAINTANCE WITH FERRIE. THE SUBPOENA CAME "AS A GREAT SURPRISE TO US," PIAZZA SAID.

The retired director of the New Orleans International Trade Mart, Clay-Shaw, was arrested by District Attorney Jim Garrison yesterday and accused of taking part "in a conspiracy to assassinate President John F. Kennedy."

No immediate charge was filed.

"There will be moe arrests," the 6 foot, 6 inch district attorney told newsmen. "I have no doubt about the case, as I have said before. The arrests will hold up. If you want to bet against me, you will lose."

#### BAIL

Garrison said Shaw, 54, an Army major during World War II, had not made a statement. He said Shaw had been questioned previously. Garrison recommended bond of \$25,000.

William-Gurvieh, chief investigator, said Shaw "will be charged with participating in a conspiracy to muder John F. Kennedy" — but he couldn't say when the formal charge would be filed.

It was announced that Shaw would remain in jail overnight.

"Special cases take special handling," said Gurvich at a tumultuous news conference in the echoing marble corridor outside Garrison's offices. "For all I know it would be several days."
