SHAW, A NATIVE OF KENTWOOD, LA., MOVED TO NEW ORLEANS WITH HIS
FAMILY AT THE AGE OF FIVE.

FOR A TIME, HE LIVED IN NEW YORK CITY, WHERE HE WAS ENGAGED IN ADVERTISING AND PUBLIC RELATIONS WORK.

DURING WORLD WAR II HE SERVED IN THE ARMY IN EUROPE, ENDING THE WAR AS A MAJOR. HE WAS AWARDED THE CROIX DE GUERRE BY FRANCE AND THE LEGION OF MERIT AND THE BRONZE STAR BY THE UNITED STATES.

SHAW RETURNED TO NEW ORLEANS IN 1947 AND WAS ONE OF THE FOUNDERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART.

ASKED IF SHAW HAD MADE A STATEMENT, GURVICH REPLIED: "NO COMMENT."

ASKED HOW LONG IT WOULD BE BEFORE FORMAL CHARGES WERE FILED;

GURVICH SAID HE DID NOT KNOW. "SPECIAL CASES TAKE SPECIAL

HANDLING," HE ADDED. "FOR ALL I KNOW IT COULD BE SEVERAL DAYS."

THE INVESTIGATOR SAID HE DID NOT KNOW WHETHER BOND WOULD BE SET IN THE CASE. HE SAID SHAW'S LAWYERS WERE CHECKING ON THE MATTER.

THE TRADE MART IS A PRIVATELY-CUPPORTED NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION FORMED TO PROMOTE TRADE THROUGH THE PORT OF NEW ORLEANS.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD, IDENTIFIED BY THE WARREN COMMISSION AS THE MAN THAT KILLED KENNEDY, PASSED OUT PRO-CASTRO LEAFLETS OUTSIDE THE TRADE MART THE FALL BEFORE THE ASSASSINATION.

SHAW SAID IN AN INTERVIEW LAST WEEK HE ONCE SAW OSWALD DISTRIBUTING THE LEAFLETS, BUT NEVER MET OR SPOKE TO HIM.

SHAW SERVED AS MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE MART FROM 1947 UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT OCT. 1, 1965.
