Irvin Dymond, an attorney for Shaw, argued that without the list of membership of the financing group, "we would be forced to rely on the testimony of grand jurors whether they were members of the group, whether they have an interest in it and whether they have rela-tives in Truth and Consequences.

"The actions of Truth and Consequences come close to violating the statutes of public bribery . . . giving money for purposes of influencing public officials," Dymond added. Haggerty told the prosecu-

tion to make a list of all members of Truth and Consequences and give it to the court. He said the list would be sealed, so that if the defense alleged after the trial that there were connections between Truth and Consequences and grand jurors, there would be some way of checking. He also ordered Garrison to keep a record of money received from Truth and Consequences and present it to the court after the Shaw trial.
