

## Shaw Lawyers Add Russo to Hearing's Subpena List

### New Set of Attorneys File Andrews Plea

Perry Raymond Russo, whose testimony earlier this year was largely responsible for Clay L. Shaw's being held over for trial on a conspiracy charge, was subpoenaed Friday by Shaw's attorneys to appear at a hearing Monday.

A previous defense subpoena listed Russo's address as the District Attorney's Office. Thursday, however, the District Attorney's office said Russo's address is 4122 Prytania, and a new subpoena was issued.

Russo, a Baton Rouge insurgent, testified at a preliminary hearing that he overheard Shaw discussing means of murdering President John F. Kennedy with David W. Ferrie and Lee Harvey Oswald at a party in Ferrie's apartment in September, 1963.

In another development, a new set of attorneys for attorney Dean A. Andrews Jr. filed a motion with Criminal District Court Judge Frank J. Shea in preparation for appealing Andrews' perjury conviction to the Louisiana Supreme Court.

Andrews was sentenced to 18 months in Parish Prison last month after his conviction on three perjury counts stemming from Grand Jury testimony in District Attorney Jim Garri-

sons' Kennedy assassination probe.

The defense motion, filed by attorneys John P. Dowling, Walter D. Kelley and Lillian M. Cohen, asks for the transcript of proceedings in Andrews trial as well as for transcripts of statements made to the district attorneys office and others.

Andrews' first attorney, Sam Monk Zelden, withdrew as counsel on the first day of court activity.

Andrews then represented himself for two days during preliminary skirmishing before the trial. Three brothers, Cecil, Harry and Bruce Burglass, represented him during the trial.

In a petition for recognition as counsel, the new attorneys said they were appearing without compensation.
