

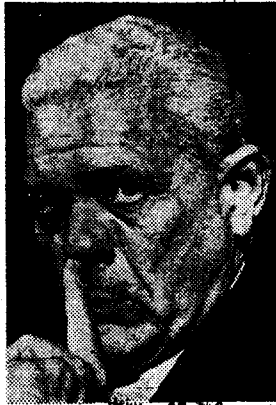

A. After they were married, John and Jacqueline Kennedy bought the house from the estate of Supreme Court Justice Robert Jackson. In 1957 when Jacqueline Kennedy decided to move into Washington, D.C., the house was sold to her in-laws, Joseph P. and Rose Kennedy. (In 1965 the house was deeded by Joseph Kennedy and wife to Ethel S. Kennedy as "a sole and separate estate free from debts, control or marital rights, including courtesy of her present or any future husband.")

New Orleans Acting Police Superintendent Presley Trosclair reported an extensive probe has cleared Lynn Losel and Louis Iyob, two of Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's investigators, of coercion and bribery charges. Mr. Trosclair admitted the officers had offered money and a job to Alvin Beaubouef in exchange for information on the Kennedy assassination but added "I don't interpret this as a violation of any law."
