DA's Men Meet Shaw Lawyers

Two more New Orleans assistant district attorneys met with defense counsel for Clay L. Shaw Thursday, but said beforehand that they were not going to discuss anything relative to DA Jim Garrison's probe into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Garrison assistants James L. Alcock and Andrew Sciambra met for two and a half hours

with attorney William J. Wegmann as part of an order issued by Federal District Judge Frederick J. R. Heebe allowing Shaw's attorneys to take depositions from Garrison assistants and investigators.

Shaw, 55, has been charged with participating in a conspiracy to kill president Kennedy in 1963. His trial was to have started next week, but Judge Heebe also signed a temporary restraining order delaying the trial.

Garrison has given orders to members of his staff instructing them not to discuss any aspect of the Kennedy investigation with defense attorneys.
