SHAW LAWYERS SEEK SUBPENAS

30 Witnesses Wanted for Motion Hearing

Attorneys for Clay L. Shaw Wednesday singled out some 30 witnesses they want to testify in a court hearing that will determine whether or not Shaw's conspiracy trial will be moved out of New Orleans.

Attorney Salvatore Panzeca presented the list of names to the office of the clerk of criminal district court and requested that subpenas be issued for appearances Tuesday at the hearing on Shaw's change-of-venue motion.

Shaw, former managing diretion of the International Trade Mark to charged by District At-

forney Jim Garrison with conspiring to murder President, John F. Kennedy in a case that will be one year old Friday. Shaw was arrested in Garrison's office March 1 last year.

The change-of-venue motion in turn accuses Garrison of a "well planned conspiracy" to prejudice prospective jurors. Defense attorneys claim a fair trial is impossible in New Orleans. They want the trial moved at least 100 miles away.

Subpenaes will probably be issued Thursday, stated Dan Haggerty of the clerk of court's office. Haggerty said names of witnesses cannot be released until they are made a part of the official record, and that will not take place until Judge Edward A. Haggerty sees them Thursday.
