

JURY WILL SEE ZAPRUDER FILM

Original Is Subpenaed in
JFK Death Probe

The original Zapruder film of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy will be delivered to the Orleans parish grand jury Thursday in compliance with a subpoena.

Asst. District Attorney James A. Alcock said Tuesday he was notified by Time Inc. that the film will be turned over to the jury for viewing.

Taken by Abraham Zapruder on Nov. 22, 1963, the film was sold to Life Magazine. The Warren Commission never viewed the original film, but worked with copies.

District Attorney Jim Garrison, who has been conducting his own inquiry into Kennedy's death for more than one year, claims that the original film will show that Kennedy was shot from the front.

The Warren commission concluded that he was shot from behind, by Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone.

Alcock requested the film in a subpoena authorized by criminal district court Judge Matthew S. Braniff.
