

Warren Report ^{Post 1-29-64}

NEW ORLEANS—District Judge Edward A. Haggerty said the Warren Report was "filled with hearsay and unsupported testimony" and a man's opinion of it would not necessarily excuse him from serving on the jury in the conspiracy trial of Clay L. Shaw.

The judge made the statement during the questioning of prospective jurors. Shaw is accused of conspiring with Lee Harvey Oswald to murder President Kennedy in 1963. The Warren Commission's report said the Kennedy assassination was solely the work of Oswald.

Hagerty excused one of the eight jurors already selected because the man was hospitalized with a kidney ailment.
