Interview with Mr. Hererra, State/ Department, Washington, D.C., 3/21/68

By prearrangement, Andrew Sciambra and I met Mr. Hererra at the 22nd and C Sts. door, just inside and to the ~~left~~ ^{right} as we entered.

Sciambra briefly identified himself and his mission, telling Mr. Hererra that he had been present at the VIP room of the New Orleans airport at a time when another or others had been present and asking if he had any recollection of those who might have been. Hererra had a clear recollection of the stop, as he explained it, from his embarrassment at leaving the tickets in his bag. He was in charge of a State Department group, the next stop being Miami.

As he went through the pictures Sciambra showed him, Mr. Hererra said, briefly, when he came to Shaw, "I have met this man, but in another connection". Later he explained that his earlier meeting with Shaw was a business one.

He was pretty certain he did not see Shaw that day at the airport.

3/24/68

Interview with Army Captain John Warren, 6731 Sangar Ave., Alexandria, Va.,
March 23, 1968, about 10:30 a.m.

We arrived at the Warren apartment a little late, pursuant to the earlier phone call of Andrew Sciambra. Captain Warren, a tall Negro, was visibly uneasy. Not until the end of the interview, and then by the accident that I wanted to use his phone, did I discover that Mrs. Warren was in the apartment, sitting on the edge of the bed. She appears to have been there in anticipation of our arrival and to have remained there, silently, through it. She was not reading a book or otherwise occupied. She just sat, fully clothed, on the edge of the made bed. I had followed Captain Warren to the bedroom when he said I might use the phone, not knowing it had a long cord and was in the bedroom.

Sciambra explained our mission. The Captain, although he described a confusing day in New Orleans, was certain there was a single man, to himself, in the VIP room, besides his own party. Changes in the plans caught him with his laundry unreturned. He remained at the hotel to await its return then joined the group, which was en route to Miami. It is his recollection that he got there about 3 p.m. He could not describe the man except to say that he was tall.

Shown the collection of pictures he took a long look at that of Benister, and at that alone. I was watching when he examined the two pictures of Shaw (neither of which is a good likeness) and he seemed to react to neither.

He insisted he could not recollect this man and that he could not identify any of the pictures. When I asked him why he stopped so long on the Benister picture, ~~when~~ I then showed him ^{the picture} he could not explain.

I wondered, from his uneasiness and his wife's strange behavior, whether he had been alerted to our visit.
