

Clay Shaw Hired By New Orleans

NEW ORLEANS (AP)

Clay Shaw, who was unsuccessfully prosecuted by New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison on a charge of plotting to assassinate President John F. Kennedy, has been appointed to a city post by Mayor Moon Landrieu.

Shaw, acquitted on the conspiracy charge in 1969 and freed recently of a perjury charge stemming from the trial, was appointed to the board of directors of the French Market Corp.

The city-owned agency directs the affairs of municipal property in the French Quarter market area.

Shaw, 57, is an internationally known businessman who headed the International Trade Mart.
