Less than 30 minutes before the judge granted Shaw tem-porary relief, the key prosecu-tion witness in the conspiracy trial refused to repeat his 1969 testimony.

Perry Raymond Russo, Garrison's start witness at the trial, invoked the Fifth Amendment protection against selfincrimination.

In pleading the Fifth Amendment, Russo refused to say whether he had seen Shaw with Oswald and David Ferrie at a New Orleans party shortly before the 1900 assessinaion of Kennedy in D

Russo also refused to answer any questions put to him about Shaw.
