District Judge Herbert W. Christenberry said he would issue a permanent injunction blocking Mr. Garrison from prosecuting Mr. Shaw in Louisiana courts on a perjury charge.

Three days after Mr. Shaw was acquitted on March 1, 1969, on charges of having conspired with Lee Harvey Oswald and others to assassinate President Kennedy, Mr. Garrison filed perjury charges against Mr.

Shaw. Mr. Garrison said Mr. Shaw had lied when he testified he did not know Oswald or the other alleged co-conspirators.

Mr. Shaw brought suit in Federal court seeking to stop his prosecution, contending he had suffered and would suffer irreparable injury because of

Mr. Garrison's continuing "mis-use and abuse of the prosecu-torial powers."
